

A SET OF COINS FROM THE SECOND HOARD OF THE 4th CENTURY DISCOVERED AT RADIMNA

ABSTRACT

In the spring of 2004, at Radimna (Caraş-Severin district) was discovered by chance the second Roman monetary hoard, which dated from the 4th c., was made out of bronze and contained between 800 and 2000 coins, the majority of which were FTR of FH type. 397 pieces arrived at Timișoara, of which we managed to publish 50: Constantius II — 40 (1 — Constantinopolis, 1 — Heraclea, 1 — Cyzicus, 2 — Roma, 8 — Sirmium, 12 — Siscia, 10 — Thessalonica, 1 — unidentifiable mint, 4 — barbarian imitations), Constantius Gallus — 3 (2 — Siscia, 1 — Thessalonica), Iulianus Apostata Caesar — 7 (2 — Sirmium, 3 — Siscia, 1 — Thessalonica, 1 — barbarian imitation).

The treasure enriches the index of the numismatic discoveries from the 4th c. in Banat.
